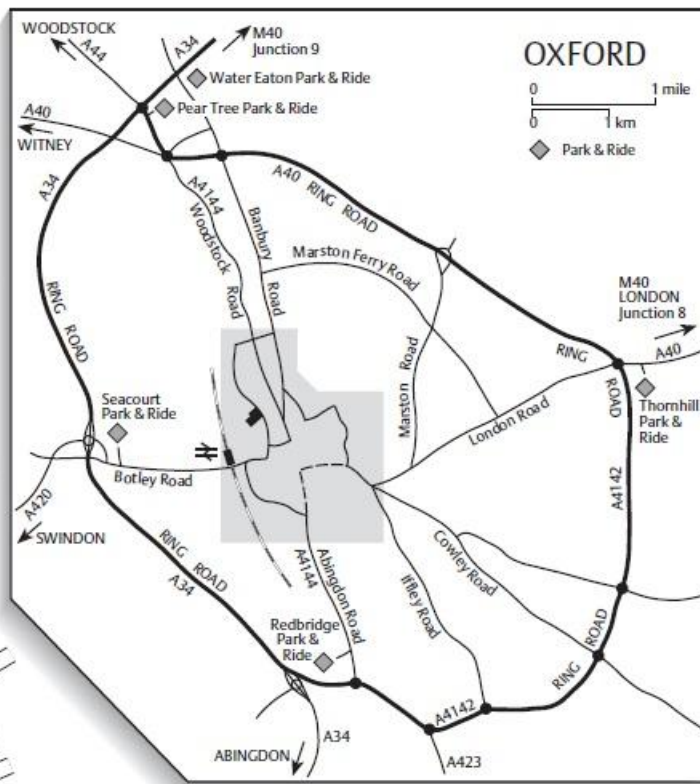

GETTING THERE

BY ROAD

from London
Leave M40 at junction 8, take A40 to Green Road roundabout continuing North on the A40 to roundabout with A44 and A4144 (Woodstock Road). Turn left towards Town Centre on A4144.

from Heathrow/Gatwick
M25 (clockwise) then M40 (west) as above.

from Birmingham
M40 (south) to junction 9, then A34. Leave at Junction with A44 (Pear Tree Roundabout) and follow signs to City Centre & University, via Woodstock Road A4144.

Oxford is served with frequent and direct coach services from London, Heathrow and Gatwick (www.oxfordbus.co.uk) and Birmingham (www.nationalexpress.com)

Please note: Parking in Oxford city centre is limited and expensive. All visitors are encouraged to use public transport, or the local park and ride facilities marked on the map.

BY RAIL

from London
Paddington station to Oxford Station

from Birmingham
Birmingham New Street station to Oxford station ([see www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk))

Oxford University Press is a ten minute walk (approximately) from Oxford Station via Park End Street, Hythe Bridge Street and then Walton Street.

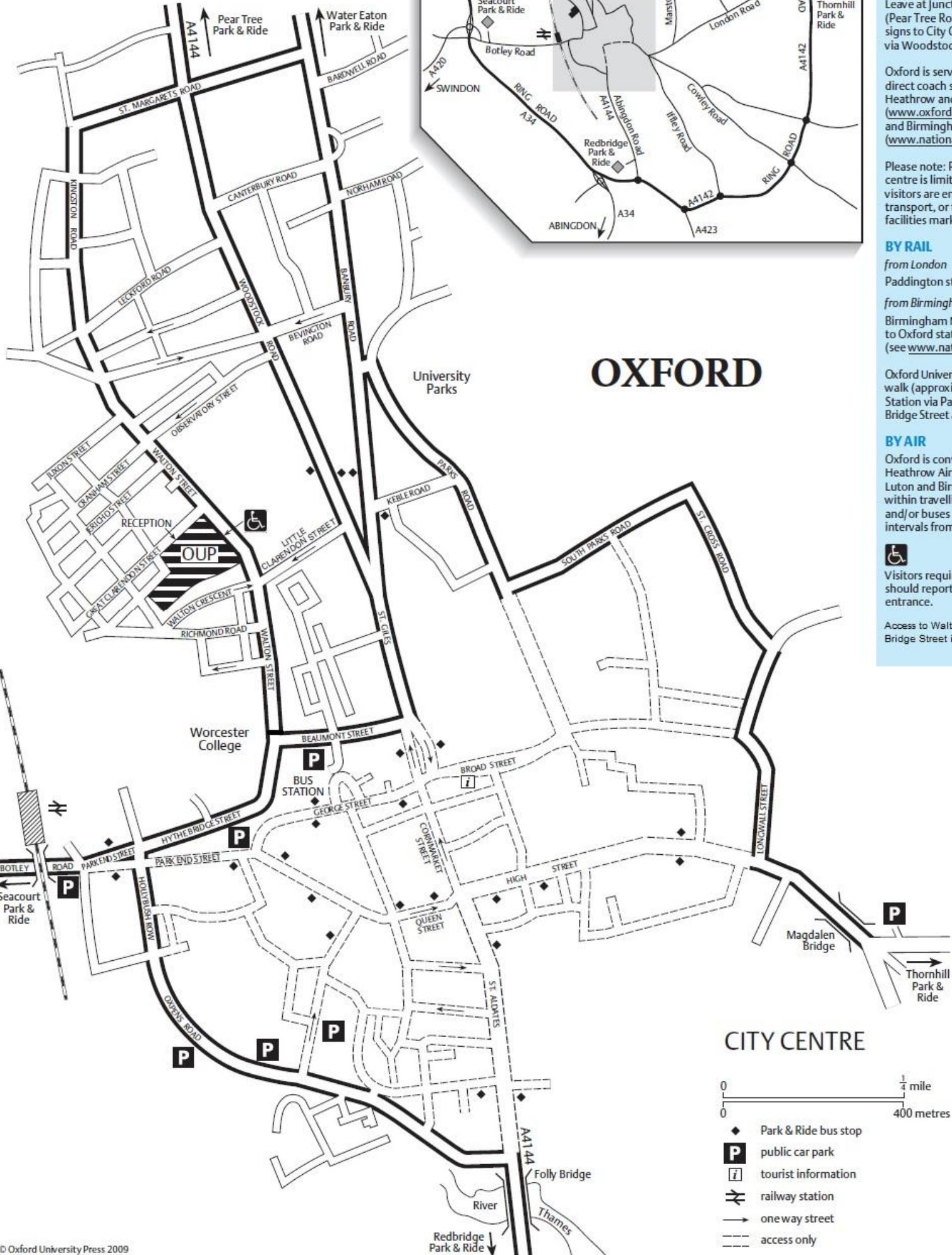
BY AIR

Oxford is conveniently close to Heathrow Airport, with Gatwick, Luton and Birmingham Airports also within travelling distance. Trains and/or buses all run at regular intervals from all airports to Oxford.



Visitors requiring disabled access should report to our Walton Street entrance.

Access to Walton Street from Hythe Bridge Street is temporarily closed.
